During April, officers took part in 34 scheduled birthday parades. Officers went to the different residences to deliver a personalized birthday wish to children who were unable to have a birthday party due to the Stay Home Stay Safe Order.



Operating While Intoxicated

On April 3, 2020 at 11:50 pm, Officer Riedy and Officer Dearing-Manning responded to the area of 235 Tree Top Circle for a suspicious vehicle.

Officers were able to find the vehicle and contacted the driver. Officers could smell an odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from the driver's breath. The driver submitted to a Preliminary Breath Test (PBT), which yielded a result of .243. The subject was arrested and lodged at the Oakland County Jail.

Aggravated Assault

On April 10, 2020 at 01:37 am, officers responded to 1650 North Opdyke Road for a felonious assault.

The investigation revealed that the hotel received a phone call from a male who said he had been stabbed and that a female was destroying the hotel room. The victim was found at a residence in Pontiac, where he told an officer that during an argument he was stabbed in the thigh with a knife. The victim refused medical treatment for his injury. The suspect was found and arrested at the hotel.

The Oakland County Prosecutor's Office authorized charges for Aggravated Assault (4-year Felony). The suspect was arraigned by the 52nd District Court and bond was set at \$15,000.00 cash.

Retail Fraud 1st Degree

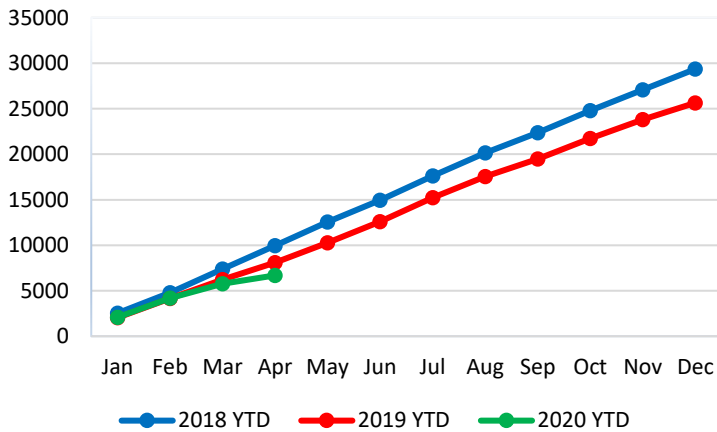
On April 14, 2020 at 12:15 pm, Officer Chubb responded to 800 Brown Road for a retail fraud incident.

Officers were advised that the responsible subject got into a vehicle near Logan's Restaurant. Sergeant Stoinski located the responsible vehicle in the parking lot and attempted to make a traffic stop. The vehicle failed to stop and continued toward Brown Road. Sergeant Stoinski terminated the stop before it turned onto Brown Road as it became clear the vehicle was not going to stop.

The responsible vehicle was located by the Oakland Sheriff's Department in Pontiac and the subject was arrested. The Oakland County Prosecutor's Office authorized charges for Retail Fraud 1st Degree and Unarmed Robbery.

Calls for Service

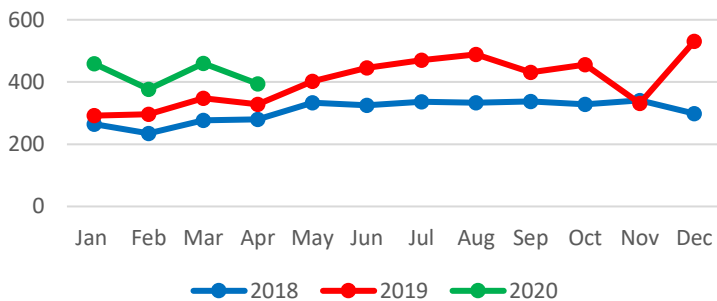
Calls for Service (Year to Date)



Officers handled 908 calls for service during April. Year to date the department has handled 6690 calls for service, which is a -17.51% decrease compared to 2019.

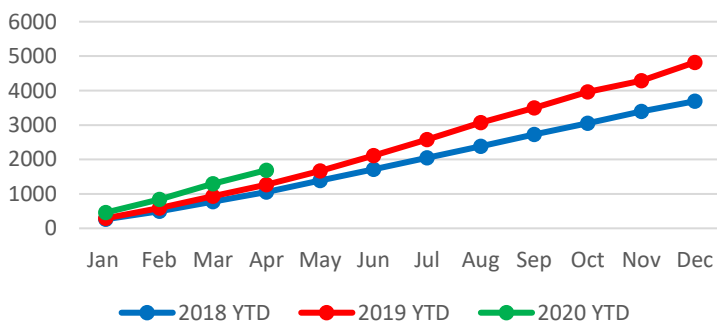
Time in Neighborhoods

Officers spent 394 hours in April in our neighborhoods. Officers spend time in our neighborhoods proactively patrolling, conducting traffic enforcement, and engaging with our residents. Year to date we have spent 1690 hours in our neighborhoods, which is a 33.70% increase compared to 2019.

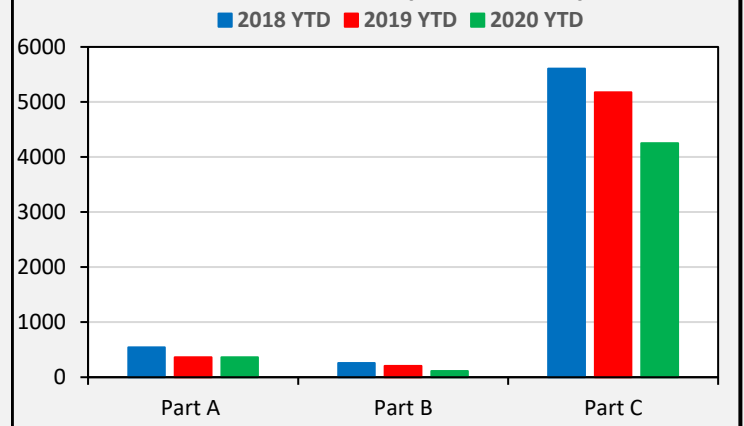
Cumulative Time in Neighborhoods (Year to Date)



Crime and Service Statistics

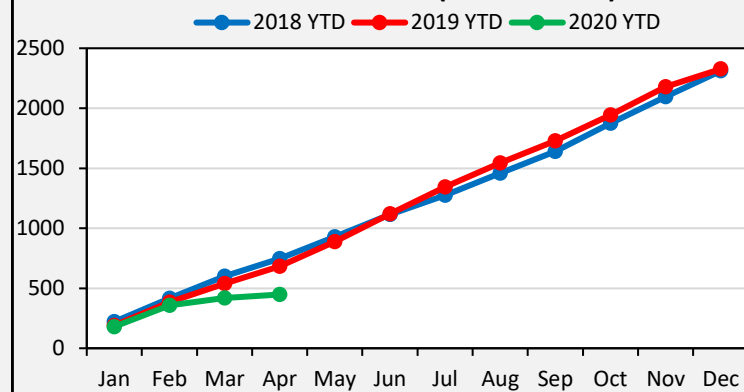
We continually strategize our responses and make the best use of the tools and personnel we have to produce the best possible outcomes.

Crime Statistics (Year to Date)



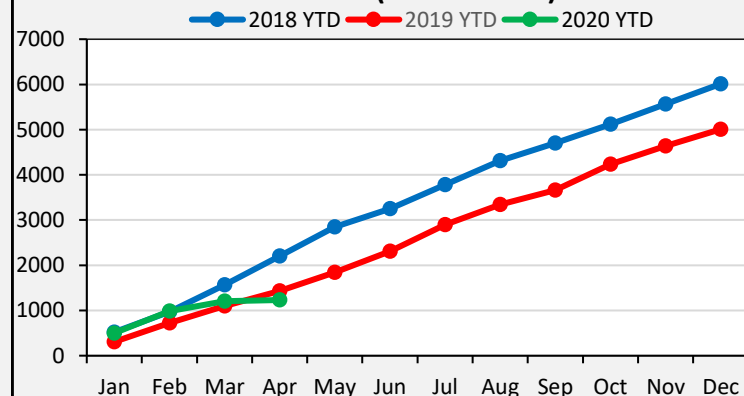
Year to date we have experienced a 0.28% increase in Part A incidents (more serious offenses), a -45.41% decrease in Part B incidents (non-violent misdemeanors), and a -17.89% decrease in Part C incidents (misdemeanor and service-related incidents) compared to 2019.

During April, we handled 29 crashes. Year to date we have experienced a -34.41% decrease in traffic crashes compared to 2019.

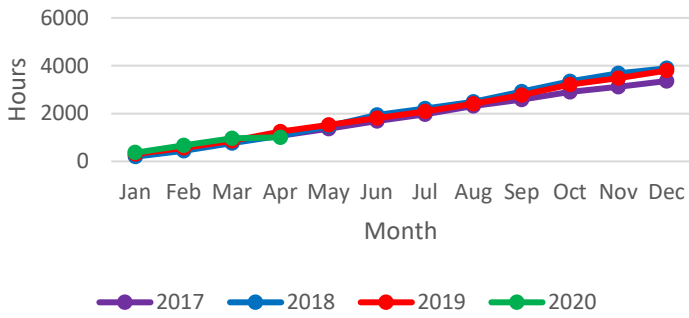
Citations (Year to Date)

Total Overtime Hours (Cumulative Year to Date)

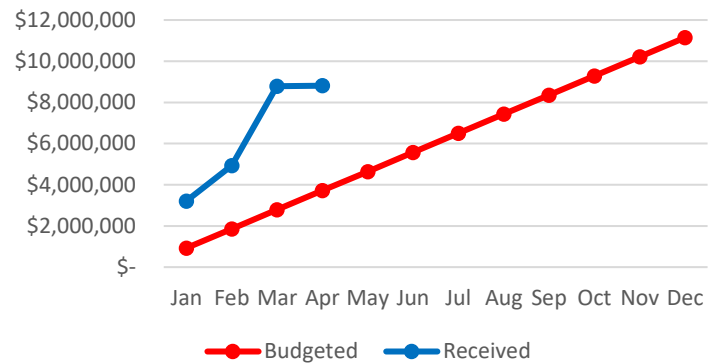


Officers worked a total of 42.25 hours of overtime in April. This is a cumulative year to date decrease in overtime of 233.75 hours compared to this same time last year.

Financial Reports

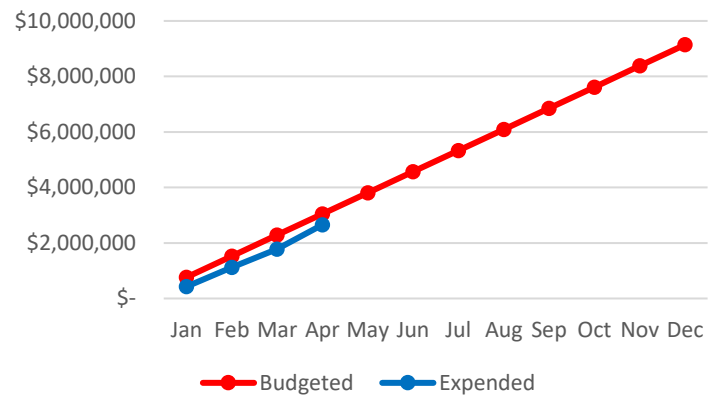
We continually analyze our department expenditures to ensure we remain within our approved budget, while delivering the best possible service to our community.
